Entry Requirements

Applicants must fulfill the following conditions:

1. Malaysian citizen.
2. MBBS, MBChB, MD or equivalent degree from a recognised university.
3. Fully registered with the Malaysian Medical Council (MMC).
4. At least 1 year clinical experience after full registration.
5. Has been endorsed by the current organization.
6. At least 3 years of service in the government of the country.
7. Age must not exceed 40 years.
8. Has never failed the course, withdrawn or declined the offer of Master of Medicine.
9. Annual performance evaluation report for the last 3 consecutive years is at least 85%.
10. Free from disciplinary action.
11. Meet the eligibility requirements of the University and the Malaysian Ministry of Health.

Entry requirements for international students:

1. Possession of an M.B.B.S., M.B.Ch.B., M.D. or equivalent degree from a university recognised and approved by the Senate.
2. Be fully registered with the Malaysian Medical Council (MMC).
3. At least one (1) year clinical experience after full registration and approval by the Senate.
4. Pass the entrance examination conducted by the Malaysian Examinations Council (MEC) and an interview with the Psychiatry Conjoint Board Committee.

The Master of Psychiatry, University Putra Malaysia (UPM) is a comprehensive postgraduate training program that aims to produce highly competent psychiatry professionals who possess in-depth knowledge and solid clinical skills. The program, which spans 4 to 7 years, is systematically divided into three phases:

PHASE 1 (YEAR 1):

Basic training covers basic medical sciences and psychiatry as well as general psychiatry and provides a broad understanding of psychiatric care.

PHASE II (YEARS 2 AND 3):

In-depth training in general psychiatry, covering various subspecialties such as child and adolescent psychiatry, addiction psychiatry, geriatric psychiatry, forensic psychiatry, rehabilitation & community psychiatry and neuropsychiatry. A mandatory completion of both psychodynamic therapy and cognitive behavior therapy to ensure practical and diverse therapeutic competence.

PHASE III (YEAR 4):

Specialized training in advanced general psychiatry and consultation and liaison psychiatry, combined with leadership and administrative skills tailored to psychiatric practice. The curriculum of the program is carefully developed and regularly reviewed by the Psychiatry Specialty Committee to align it with the national curriculum and ensure that the training remains relevant and current. The Master of Psychiatry program is an intensive full-time training program in which trainees undertake clinical duties, allowing a close link between academic learning and practical clinical experience.

- Case Based Discussions (CBD) to promote critical thinking and clinical decision making.
- Mini Clinical Evaluation Exercises (Mini CEX) for real-time feedback on clinical skills.
- Professional Presentations (PP) to develop communication and teaching skills.
- Procedural Based Assessments (PBA) to review procedural skills.
- Intervention-based assessments (IBA), including psychotherapy, to ensure effective therapeutic interventions.
